# Easter Sunday Resurrection of the Lord April 1, 2018

#### **MOUNTAINS OF LOVE**

Natural disasters are sometimes called "acts of God" – as if the kind of act God does is always violent and unpredictable. But at Easter we remember another mighty act of God, the raising of Christ from the dead. That is the action that defines God's others.

Still, there are times of great distress at home and far away. But these are not signs of God's anger. They are distractions from the overwhelming message of God's love. One of the readings for the Easter Vigil brings welcome relief to anyone who ever felt abandoned by God. Isaiah compares the situation between God and Israel as a marriage that broke up briefly but is now back together. God speaks with reassurance. "I have sworn not to be angry with you, or to rebuke you."

There will be times of distress. Home life will have moments of disintegration. Trusted friends will turn away. Role models will let you down. And there will be natural disasters. "Though the mountains leave their place and the hills be shaken," God says through Isaiah, "my love shall never leave you." God does not say that mountains will stay put. They may move. As we put another Lent behind us, let us rejoice in the good news of Easter.Jesus is risen — God's love never fails!
